## SHERIFF GOLDEN PROVIDES STUDENTS WITH AN INSIDE LOOK OF LAW ENFORCEMENT

**Freehold:** Sheriff Shaun Golden spoke to students from Manalapan High School's Law and Public Safety Program on March 19 about the law enforcement and emergency operations of the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office. It was all part of the Sheriff's Prison Awareness Program (SPA), where students get the opportunity to tour several law enforcement facilities and learn about the day to day operations.

"This is an eye opening experience for these students," said Sheriff Shaun Golden. "By observing what goes on and speaking directly to law enforcement officials, provides students with the knowledge and insight into the criminal justice system."

Thirty one students were guided on a tour of the Monmouth County Police Academy to see the type of training that is required of law enforcement officers. They also visited the Monmouth County 9-1-1 Communications Center and observed how public safety telecommunicators handle emergency calls and radio transmissions. The final phase of the program ended with a tour of the Monmouth County Correctional Institution, a nationally accredited direct supervision facility, where SPA Coordinator Lt. Thomas Bollaro and C/O Dennis Cleary provided the students with an overview of corrections.
