

Jurisdiction: Borough of Lake Como

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**#1) Projects Underway or Completed with Mitigation Grant funding – quarterly Reports on file with NJSP OEM Mitigation Unit: (Brief Project Description)**

Project #2: Residential elevations: Some homes have been elevated, some are in the process of being elevated, and some remain to be elevated.

Project #7: Emergency Building Generator, First Aid building: The Borough has awarded the bid for an emergency generator for this building, Project HMPG 4806 and will be completed in 2016.

**#2) Which Projects listed in HMP (appendix 1.9) are still valid and to be considered for funding:**

Project #1: Drainage, Berm Build up (This project is a project of the 3 towns that surround the lake [Belmar, Lake Como and Spring Lake]) Estimated costs approximately \$2,000,000.

Project #2: Residential Elevations: More homes need to be elevated; estimated costs are \$100,000 per home.

Project # 3: Infrastructure improvements to address brown drinking water, and water quality issues. The Borough has funded one portion of the project through USDA, however, 3 other parts (phases) of town have to be completed. Phase I was 3.4 million dollars and the remaining three phases are anticipated to cost approximately 4 million dollars.

Project #4: Purchase a generator for Emergency Shelter located at the Academy Charter High School, estimated cost \$100,000.

Project # 5: Purchase a generator for the Central Command Center of OEM, Municipal Complex; estimated cost \$80,000.

Project #6: Purchase a generator for the Public Works building; Estimated cost \$40,000.

Project #8: Infrastructure project: Hurricane Windows and roof straps for the Emergency Command Center; Estimated cost \$75,000.

**#3) Projects underway or completed (identified in appendix 1.9, or not) using funding other than Mitigation Grants: (Brief Project Description)**

Project # 3: Infrastructure improvements to address brown drinking water and water quality issues: The Borough has completed the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of 4 phases by relining pipes in one section of town. The other 3 areas of town have to be completed. The town has received a loan and grant from the USDA and is pursuing additional funding for the remaining 3 sections of town.
