The Monmouth County Police Academy ended the year with 49 newly sworn in law enforcement officers, who graduated and received their police training commission certificates on Dec. 14, after completing




COMMUNITY AND COUNTY AWARENESS CEREMONY



The MCSO was proud and pleased to acknowledge the participants of our Community and County Awareness Program during a ceremony at the Monmouth County Police Academy on Dec. 7. The program was created in collaboration with Principal Richard Allen of Poseidon Early College High School in Neptune as a partnership to promote community and county awareness in communities and introduce students to the Constitutional Officers.



Students were required to visit 9 community locations such as police departments, firehouses, municipal and first aid buildings and libraries, where they interviewed people and wrote a report. A total of 65 students participated in the program. They were from Middletown High School South, Manalapan High School and the NJ United Christian Academy, Manalapan.
