MCSO PARTICIPATES IN UDRIVE, UTEXT, UPAY

The MCSO, along with partners in law enforcement, will be cracking down on distracted drivers during the month of April as part of New Jersey's UDrive, UText, UPay, enforcement campaign.

Beginning April 1, which marks the start of Distracted Driving Awareness Month, and running through April 21, the high visibility law enforcement initiative will target motorists who engage

in dangerous, distracted driving behaviors, such as talking on handheld cell phones and sending text messages while driving.



We have seen too many crashes on

our roadways as a result of distracted driving and this campaign will hopefully raise awareness of the dangers. Texting and talking on a cell phone while driving, is irresponsible and illegal. It takes the focus off of the roads and may have deadly consequences that otherwise could be avoided.


attended. Students had the opportunity to meet with federal, state, county and local law enforcement to obtain advice and discuss career opportunities. Meet and greets are always a great way to network.

Thanks to the great work from the exceptional women at the MCSO.














EXPLORER POST PRACTICE DRILL & CEREMONY
