## SHERIFF GOLDEN URGES ALL TO HAVE A SAFE HOLIDAY WEEKEND

It's been a great summer in Monmouth County, and the exceptional work of the sworn officers and staff of the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office, in maintaining public safety throughout the busy season is commended. As we enjoy the unofficial end of summer this Labor Day weekend, with backyard barbeques and holiday parties,



there will be an increase of travelers on the roads. Law enforcement will be out in full force and remain vigilant to keep roadways safe and free of drunk drivers.

Please make the most of the Labor Day weekend, but, if you are going to drink, don't drive, it's as simple as that.

In an effort to avoid presenting a danger to oneself or others, it's important to follow these safety tips:

- Before going out, designate a driver who will not consume any alcohol the entire night.
- DO NOT DRIVE if you are impaired. Call a cab, an Uber, a sober friend or family member.
- If you don't have a ride, stay where you are.
- If you see someone about to get behind the wheel or on a motorcycle after they have been drinking, take their keys and find them a ride with someone who is sober.
- Under no circumstances should adults provide alcohol to a minor or allow anyone under 21 to consume alcohol while at their home.

In New Jersey, an individual is considered over the legal limit if he/she operates a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol concentration of .08 or greater.



## SWIMMING SAFETY AT THE SHORE



# MCSO'S NEW SOFTWARE TO ASSIST IN SHELTER OPERATIONS

The MCSO is always planning and preparing in the event of a weather related incident. Sheriff Golden, OEM Coordinator Mike Oppegaard, members of MCSO IT Department and Monmouth County Health Department tested and trained on a new automated shelter registration platform through ESRI Geographical Information Systems, (GIS) on August 27.

The software is a tremendous asset when registering individuals who need to be placed in a shelter, during a significant weather event, since it speeds up the registration process and makes officials aware of requests and needs of individuals.



## SHERIFF SPEAKS ABOUT SUCCESS OF 911 TECHNOLOGY

Sheriff Golden was pleased to talk to the The Two River Times about the advances the MCSO's Communications Center has made the past year.

On August 15, the sheriff explained RapidSOS, a technology that allows public safety telecommunicators to determine the location of an individual who dials 911 from a wireless phone.

Despite the lack of funding and a diversion from the State of New Jersey regarding the 911 system the past 10 years, the MCSO is committed to seeking out ways to improve emergency response to residents and visitors of Monmouth County and leads the way in public safety technology.

Sheriff Golden and MCSO staff greeted many people, discussed safety programs and presented displays and demos for all to see. The MCSO participated in National Night Out


events in eight towns throughout Monmouth County on August 6.


## MCSO OFFERS GREAT OPPORTUNITY TO RESIDENTS



The MCSO Citizen Police Academy/ Law Enforcement Mini Academy is once again being offered to county residents ages 14 and above. It is a unique opportunity to learn about the complex roles of modern-day law enforcement. Speakers from the Monmouth County Sheriff's office and other public safety agencies offer insight into their roles in law enforcement as well as the role of citizens in assisting in those agencies in the war against crime and terrorism.

Enrollment in this course involves a 6-week commitment to attend weekly classes at the Monmouth County Sheriff's Public Safety Center in Freehold. Each session will take place on six consecutive Thursday evenings from 5:30 PM to approximately 7:30 PM. The first session is on Thursday, September 19. ## THAT'S ONE DEDICATED VOLUNTEER





Although "retiring" from the SEEK program, Rich remains active as a VISCOMP volunteer.




## MCSO SALUTES K-9S ON NATIONAL DOG DAY
