Have a plan, know where you are going before heading out and what the rules and regulations are beforehand, since they may differ from town to town.



- Have have a plan. Know what the rules/ regulations are beforehand & follow them.
- Be aware that the rules may differ from town to town, beach to beach.
- Adhere to parking restrictions and look out for pedestrians while driving.
- Practice social distancing.
- It's recommended to wear a face covering.

- Don't rely on public facilities to be open - restrooms, eating areas etc.
- Wash hands frequently.
- Do not liter.
- Be sure to swim when a lifeguard is on duty.
- Swim responsibly, close to the shore and not in rough surf.

Sheriff's Officers have been busy riding and walking the beat in county parks to ensure safety by making sure all are adhering to restrictions. Our parks are some of the most beautiful sights around Monmouth County and NJ, and Sheriff Golden thanks visitors who have been taking the proper precautions amid the COVID-19 crisis.

The MCSO's Communications Division, Law Enforcement Division and the Monmouth County Police Academy participated in its virtual assessment process to maintain national accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies the week of May 11. With national accreditation, the Law Enforcement Division, Communications Division and Police Academy are able to compare and evaluate their operations against nationally accepted standards of practice, and continuously upgrade the Divisions' and Academy's performance.

The process included virtual visits and interviews. Sheriff Golden commends staff for their hard work and thanks assessors for accommodating the virtual assessment process. The final credentialing decision is made by the Board of CALEA Commissioners expected to take place in July.

The Monmouth County Sheriff's Office was the first sheriff's office in the nation to accomplish "Five Star Accreditation" for simultaneous accreditation of the Law Enforcement Division.







The Monmouth County Sheriff 's Office OEM partnered with the City of Long Branch, the Monmouth County Health Department Medical Reserve Corps, the Monmouth County Division of Weights and Measures and the Manalapan Certified Emergency Response Team (CERT) to ensure that meals were provided to families in need from Long Branch. The organizer of the Saint Luke's Methodist Church Food Pantry was ill and unable to operate the scheduled food distribution in Long Branch. The pantry exceeded its capacity the week before and several hundred families were relying on this operation since they had no other means for food.

As a result, MCSO OEM and Long Branch OEM initiated a plan to collaboratively assure that the pantry went on as scheduled.





The Monmouth County Sheriff's Office is extremely grateful to Vested Interest in K9s Inc., for their generosity and dedication.

The MCSO is warning the public to be aware of SCAMS circulating across the state in an effort to take advantage of people amid the COVID-19 crisis. The SCAM that's affected at least 10 counties including Monmouth pertains to bail fraud. Scammers are calling people, and in some cases, going to their homes and knocking on doors with

gloves and masks, to report that a family member has been arrested and in need of bail money. Some individuals have been scammed out of \$20,000. Under no circumstances does anyone call or show up at a home to collect bail money.

If you have become a victim contact local police immediately, and if possible, safely get a description of scammers, vehicles and license plates. In regards to any SCAM, always use your best judgement. If it doesn't seem right, it's probably not.
