DID YOU KNOW

Did You Know Hurricane Seasons begins June 1st and ends Novembers 30th?

Please Plan, Prepare and Stay Informed. As our lives get back to normal with outdoors gatherings, barbeques and parties, please do not drink and drive. Before going out, designate a driver who will not consume any alcohol. If you are impaired, call an Uber, a cab, a sober friend or family member. If you don't have a ride, stay where you are. If you see someone about to get behind the wheel, or on a motorcycle, after they have been drinking, offer to find them a ride or alert your nearest law enforcement agency.

For the many beachgoers, please follow the proper precautions when swimming. Make sure your children know how to swim before entering the water, swim when lifeguards are on duty and never swim alone. Avoid rip currents, and if you get caught in one, swim parallel to the shore.

Also know the weather forecast when swimming in the ocean and be aware of rough surf and signs telling you not to swim. In addition, if you are boating out on the waterways, it's important to practice safe boating tips. The MCSO Marine 1, along with partners in law enforcement will be patrolling the shore areas throughout the season in an effort to ensure safety and respond to critical water related incidents.

Let's all enjoy the season and think safety at the shore this summer.

BDATING SAFETY TIPS

- Have a checklist and follow it prior to departure.
- Operate at a safe speed, be aware of your surroundings, and stay clear of large vessels.
- Make sure there is more than one person who can handle operations of the boat.
- Be sure that all know how to swim.
- Wear a life jacket properly.
- Do not consume alcohol prior to or while out on a vessel. It is illegal to operate a boat with a blood alcohol level of .08 or higher which could result in mandatory loss of boating and driving privileges.

ACTIVITY TO POLICE

ACTIVE SHOOTER DRILL CONDUCTED

An active shooter training exercise with County and local law enforcement, EMS and fire departments in the Bayshore Region was held on May 26 at Raritan High School in Hazlet in an effort to plan and be at the ready in the event an emergency were to occur.

The exercise was conducted to test and improve response and to see how well our municipal and county-level agencies collaborate with one other during the stress of a realistic simulation. The training will help strengthen the coordination and communication between public safety agencies across the region.

ACCOLADES GOING TO THE DOGS WITH SOME NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS

A notable achievement by the MCSO's K-9 Unit as five of our teams achieved National Certification from the United States Police Canine Association, Inc. after competing in the trials held May 2 - 5. The USPCA has set the gold standard in K-9 training for 50 years and this is the first time in history that the MCSO has five nationally certified teams.

Individual team awards went to:

Sgt. Lasko & S/O Kroeper came in 3rd place Top Department Team in the Nation.

Our newest K-9 team also earned bragging rights as S/O Elizabeth Imbriacco and K-9 Maggie received National Certification by the National Police Bloodhound Association.

The trials took place in Maryland and Maggie had a pawsome experience impressing trainers.

Sheriff Golden is proud to have such a well established and highly trained K-9 unit who works year round to assist local police departments with narcotics detection, explosive detection and criminal or missing person searches.
