MILITARY HONORS FOR FORGOTTEN VETERANS

As the Monmouth County Sheriff, I could not have been more proud or honored for the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office to have coordinated and participated in the Military Honors For Forgotten Veterans event on June 23. This momentous tribute which was a huge effort led by the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office, the Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 12, the Manalapan Police



Department, the Ocean County Sheriff's Office, the Monmouth County Board of County Commissioners and CentraState Medical Center provided 23 veterans and two spouses from WWI, WWII, Korea and Vietnam War eras whose remains were never claimed, with a salute to arms and a proper sendoff.

We could never repay our veterans for the sacrifices they have made, but what we can do is never forget. It's vital that these veterans who served our country are given respect and provided a proper burial filled with dignity and honor. We should all have tremendous appreciation for the Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 12 who help make that happen through their commitment and tireless work to ensure forgotten veterans receive full military honors.

The Vietnam Veterans of America - Chapter 12's mission is to identify and claim those cremated remains of honorably discharged veterans and their spouses who have been abandoned and left on shelves in funeral homes.

Department where many gathered for salute to arms and a reading of the names of the 23 veterans and two spouses. Their urns, with a flag on each one, were placed in a vehicle, which led the procession towards the veterans' final resting place. During the procession, three stops

were made to pay tribute to the forgotten veterans. Crowds gathered along the route at the Monmouth County Hall of Records, Centrastate Medical Center in Freehold Township, and, with the assistance of the Ocean County Sheriff's Office, Prospertown Lake in Jackson. Once the procession reached the Brigi General William C. Doyle Memorial Cemetary, there was a call to order, posting of colors by the Monmouth County



Sheriff's Office and the Manalapan Police Department's Honor Guard, a presentation of arms, a prayer to honor our veterans, a flag presentation, taps and the retiring of the colors, prior to the burial.

A tremendous amount of time, effort and dedication was put into this event for the 23 forgotten veterans and two spouses, whose memory will live eternally, as we all remain ever mindful of the sacrifices they made.

HURRICANE SEASON BEGINS

Hurricane season began June 1 and lasts through November 30, and now is the time to take the proper precautions to ensure the safety of residents and communities. Preparing, planning and staying informed is of the utmost importance.

All residents should 'Know Your Zone'. The Monmouth County Sheriff's Office was the first in the state to implement this lifesaving evacuation plan, which is designed to educate residents, businesses and visitors on the coastal evacuation zone in which they live, work or vacation. The plan identifies specific coastal evacuation zones (A, B, C and D) that helps emergency management officials target evacuation orders to those areas that are at the most risk, based upon threat, strength, direction and forecasted storm surge. To find your zone, visit MCSONJ.ORG/READY and enter your address.





Furthermore, the sheriff 's office is urging residents to have emergency notifications and

public safety information at their fingertips, through the Monmouth County Sheriff 's Office Application (app) for smartphones. The application is designed for Android and iOS platforms and can be downloaded for free. The app provides instant access to sheriff's office related information, which includes real-time emergency notifications through its integrated push notification system that automatically displays the message on the phone. Users are able to be instantly alerted to weather, or other emergency related situations, from the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office and the agency's Office of Emergency Management.

As always it's also important to be sure to have a family kit, with all the basic necessities.

While we hope the hurricane season is uneventful, it's vital to please share this valuable information with family and friends to help maintain safety all throughout hurricane season.

BEACH SAFETY TIPS

It's always important to stress safety at the shore during the summer season as the beaches become packed with swimmers and sun bathers. The MCSO urges all to please make sure you/



your children know how to swim before entering the water, swim when lifeguards are on duty, never swim alone, avoid rip currents and if you get caught in one, swim parallel to the shore.

SHERIFF GOLDEN APPOINTED TO NEW 911 STRIKE FORCE

Sheriff Golden has been appointed as a member of the newly created 911 Strike Force by the Federal Communications Commission, which will study and address the ongoing issue of 911 diversion fees.

The first meeting which was video conferenced was held June 3. Sheriff Golden takes great pride in serving on this strike force and looks forward to actively participating and representing the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office, which runs the 911 Communications Center, the largest shared service in the county. Thanks to the FCC for its dedication to taking action in creating this advisory committee to end diversion fees. It will help ensure that funding will be spent on upgrading 9-1-1 systems, which will enhance the safety and well-being of our residents during emergencies.



RECRUITS GRADUATE FROM POLICE ACADEMY

Sheriff Golden was pleased to announce the graduation of 59 newly sworn law enforcement officers from the Monmouth County Police Academy. On June 11, 15 recruits of the 100th Basic Course for Police Officers and 44 recruits from the 51st Basic Course for Class II Special Law Enforcement Officers received their police training commission certifications during a ceremony at Brookdale Community College.

GREAT TO JOB MCSO K-9 TEAM


