Please make the most of the weekend, but, if you are going to drink, don't drive. To avoid presenting a danger to oneself or others, it's important to follow important safety tips:

- Before going out, designate a driver who will not consume any alcohol the entire night.
- DO NOT DRIVE if you are impaired. Call an Uber, a cab, a sober friend or family member.
- If you don't have a ride, stay where you are.
- If you see someone about to get behind the wheel or on a motorcycle after they have been drinking, take their keys and find them a ride with someone who is sober.
- Under no circumstances should adults provide alcohol to a minor or allow anyone under 21 to consume alcohol while at their home.



Sheriff Golden warns that it's vital to take the proper precautions while at the beach, especially when rip currents are elevated. He urges all to stay out of the water when there's rough surf and never swim alone if there are no lifeguards.

- Don't fight the current
- Swim out of the current, then to shore
- If you can't escape, float or tread water
 If you need help, call or wave for assistance

AUGUST IS NATIONAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AWARENESS MONTH


August was National Emergency Management Awareness Month, a time to recognize the important work that is done to keep communities safe in times of crisis.






HAPPY BIRTHDAY SHERIFF GOLDEN
