Pursuant to Attorney General Law Enforcement Directive No. 2022-14, every state, county, and local law enforcement agency in New Jersey is required to submit to the Attorney General and the County Prosecutor, and publish on the agency's public website, a brief synopsis of all complaints where a termination, reduction in rank or grade, and/or suspension of more than five days, as well as sustained findings listed in the above directive, regardless of the type or severity of discipline imposed, was assessed to an agency member. On 4/30/2025, CPO Lewis received a 90 day suspension, after an internal affairs investigation sustained that on 10/21/2024, he failed to act and assist officers who were in an active use of force situation with a non-compliant inmate and failed to call for an emergency response, as required by policy, to provide the additional staff needed to gain control of the non-compliant inmate and secure the situation. The investigation further sustained that his official report of the incident contained misrepresentations and omissions of facts, and when interviewed regarding this incident, he provided false statements and information which conflicted with what he previously reported.

On 4/30/2025, CPO Beckenstein received a 90 day suspension and demotion from Senior Investigator to a County Correctional Police Officer, after an internal affairs investigation sustained that he failed to provide all the evidence to the Monmouth County Prosecutor's Office, for multiple criminal cases regarding the destruction of county property and several assaults on staff, causing the cases to be merged and the defendant being offered 8 months time served instead of the 3-5 years imprisonment for each of the 8 separate cases.

On 10/28/2025, CPO Valasa received a 6 day suspension after an investigation sustained that she failed to search an inmate when escorting her from her housing unit to be transported to court. The inmate was then transported to the courthouse where she was searched by receiving Officers at the courthouse and found to be in possession of CDS on her person. The investigation further confirmed the inmate obtained the CDS from her cell inside her housing unit and the CDS was on her person prior to leaving her housing unit that morning and throughout her escort and subsequent transport to the courthouse.
