## Plan Review Checklist

The Plan Review Checklist is completed by FEMA. States and local governments are encouraged, but not required, to use the PRT as a checklist to ensure all requirements have been met prior to submitting the plan for review and approval. The purpose of the checklist is to identify the location of relevant or applicable content in the plan by element/sub-element and to determine if each requirement has been “met” or “not met.” FEMA completes the “required revisions” summary at the bottom of each element to clearly explain the revisions that are required for plan approval. Required revisions must be explained for each plan sub-element that is “not met.” Sub-elements in each summary should be referenced using the appropriate numbers (A1, B3, etc.), where applicable. Requirements for each element and sub-element are described in detail in Section 4: Local Plan Requirements of this guide.

Plan updates must include information from the current planning process.

If some elements of the plan do not require an update, due to minimal or no changes between updates, the plan must document the reasons for that.

Multi-jurisdictional elements must cover information unique to all participating jurisdictions.

- Table 3.5-1 is very clear and useful to see which entities were involved in the different planning meetings.

#### Opportunities for Improvement

- While municipal attendance at the planning meetings is robust, it would be nice if each jurisdiction had a representative present at every meeting.
- While the county should be commended for inviting a wide array of stakeholders to the planning meetings, there are some other entities that would be good to have involved in the planning process for future plan development efforts. This includes, but is not limited to, New Jersey Transit, private transportation providers, Ocean County OEM, HHPD owners from neighboring counties that could impact Monmouth in the event of dam failure, school districts, municipal planning departments, private planning firms, and housing developers.
- It would be helpful to include how the public response was to the plan. For future plans, the county might want to include the number of public participants that attended meetings or submitted comments and from which jurisdictions they come from. This data would be helpful for improving or refining outreach strategies for soliciting feedback.
