



#### Actual event

Following the occurrence of a real-world event, the coordinator may submit an entry to the tool for credit. In order to be approved, the submission will include the following information:

- a) Start and end dates
- b) Exercise Type = "actual event"
- Fulfillment of EPCRA exercise obligations
- d) Location
- e) Primary host
- f) Scenario description
- g) Event description
- h) Applicable mission areas
- i) Core capabilities utilized
- j) Objectives
- k) Participants (by agency and role)
- 1) Strengths, opportunities for improvement, and corrective actions
- m) Submitter's name, role, and contact info



# SERC - State Emergency Response Commission

• In the past, the terms Local Emergency Planning Committee and Emergency Management Council were used interchangeably, which led to confusion. The term LEPC applies **only** to EO 161 and 284. See Directive NJOEM-5 (2022).




# Responsibilities of the LEPCs

• Shall include representation of all 12 stakeholder groups:

Elected officials	EMS	Local media
Emergency Management	Health	Community groups
Law enforcement	Local environmental and transportation	Facility representatives
Fire service	Hospitals	Local businesses

- Develop an emergency response plan (off-site ERP) for their community/district
- Update the (off-site) ERP at least annually
- Establish procedures for receiving reports from facilities
- Complete (off-site) ERPs and review/exercise them annually
- Provide public access to review (off-site) ERPs










# Jersey Shore University Medical Center (JSUMC) Hospital at Home pilot

- Hospital at Home is a program that allows for acute inpatient level care to be delivered to the patient in their own home. Care will be provided through a partnership between JSUMC and Hackensack Meridian at Home clinicians.

- OEM Plan Essentially, if there's a forecasted event, such as a hurricane, the patients will be brought back to the hospital and no other patients would be entered into the program. In situations where they have for example an extended power outage and they could not remain at home, that's when they are instructed to contact our HMH EMS provider for transport back to the hospital. If there's a no notice event, such as a tornado damaging their home, they are instructed to use the same 9-1-1 system as any other resident.


